

# Dingwall Community Woodland Local Resident Consultation Responses October 2020

Do you like the idea of a Community Woodland for Dingwall? 187 responses




## If yes, what are the main reasons? (tick all that apply) 186 responses

- Phased from farm to community over time (years) as the community builds experience and knowledge from the farm. 7 people suggested this
- Can it be co-owned and managed by both the Knockbain Farm and community **2 people** suggested this
- How about the Schools manage the area as educational classes under the management and direction of Knockbain Farm

Note: Words in bold were mentioned more than once, underlined are words/ideas mentioned frequently.

#### Community

- Physical & mental health
  - Would encourage more locals to be more active and take part in the community projects
  - Outings for people who wouldn't be able to get there under their own steam
  - Work with groups like orienteering club & Dementia Scotland
  - Woodland trails for walkers/runners
  - Trim Trail/Outdoor fitness equipment
- A natural playpark. All things made from wood, recycled materials etc.
- Sensory areas
- Seating
  - A small clear area for people to enjoy a picnic on a sunny day/ picnic benches
  - Bench viewpoints
  - Some nice seating in a nature feeding area, so we can quietly observe them
- Memorial trees and benches
- Outdoor toilets would be really helpful for families/visitors
- With an eye to future pandemics, could incorporate outdoor gathering spaces such as an **amphitheatre** or other space where social distanced gathering is possible.
- Carpark

#### Education

- Educational resource for **schools/nurseries** to be involved.
  - Outdoor nursery
  - Education trail
  - Bug hotels
  - Children to learn about respecting the outdoors
- A **covered shelter** to act as an **outdoor classroom** for adult/children groups. This could include visits such as the dementia group, local nurseries etc.
- Nature education
  - Tree identification
  - Bird song/ bird watching walks
  - Work with other groups to offer courses/walks
- Learning boards
- Learning for how to restore natural spaces and how to survey for wildlife

#### Access/ Inclusivity

- Different walks suitable for different ages and disabilities
- Wheelchair friendly
- Access to the area from the town itself, so people don't have to drive to it and park

- Dog friendly
- Buggy-able paths
- Circular routes
- Linked paths to Dingwall Mart or Hector MacDonald Monument graveyard and Peffery Way
- Safe access and safe space for school children/early years

#### Nature

- Plant only native trees
- Leave standing and fallen deadwood in situ in the future
- Carefully plant the understory too with blaeberry, holly, etc to encourage wildlife to thrive
- Ponds
- Feeding areas for different animals
- Wildflower meadow
- Bird/bat/squirrel boxes
- Scrubby shrubby weedy areas to increase the habitat potential of the site
- Guelder rose for berries for birds in the autumn
- SNH, RSPB, Forestry Scotland or other conservation charities to get involved, offer advice or support.

#### Art

- Wood sculptures/stone circles
- Fairy houses
- Storytelling

#### **Food Growing**

- Community allotments/garden
- Summer fruits (e.g. **orchard**, brambles, rosehips, elderberries) and winter veg for either community to help themselves or **donate to local charity e.g. community fridge**
- Foraging e.g. fungi


#### Generating Income

- Cafe
- Manage for long term native timber
- Outdoor nursery could be established as source of income
- In Evanton there was the opportunity for every home to make a donation at the beginning of the project (when the wood was bought) so that people felt they had an interest in it.

#### Other

 As a Fortrose resident I would be really interested to see how a community project like this could be used to stimulate interest within other communities such as Fortrose.
